11	Carolina Panthers	Carolina's offense sputtered, but it's defense was impressive, holding Buffalo to 176 yards.
12	Dallas Cowboys	The 'Boys are going to be hopping mad when they come to Arizona for Monday Night Football. Ruh roh.
13	Seattle Seahawks	The Seahawks recorded their first TD of the season at 7:06 of the fourth quarter of Week 2.
14	Tennessee Titans	The Titans ran for 179 yards in a dominant performance against the Jaguars.
15	Houston Texans	QB Deshaun Watson showed up in a black tuxedo for his first NFL start.
16	Detroit Lions	Jamal Agnew's punt return TD is the Lions' third since the start of last season, most in the NFL.
17	Arizona Cardinals	Kicking savior Phil Dawson is 4-6 on FG attempts and nearly cost the Cards an ugly win at Indy.
18	Washington Redskins	QB Kirk Cousins was solid, if unspectacular in a bounce-back after last week's three-INT performance.
19	Jacksonville Jaguars	Calais Campbell was quiet in Week 2. So were the Jaguars in a blowout loss to Tennessee.
20	Minnesota Vikings	Sam Bradford's left knee injury is reportedly not a long-term concern.
21	Miami Dolphins	Jay Cutler was turnover-free in his Dolphins debut as Jay the game manager.
22	Los Angeles Rams	The Rams had a chance to really grab L.A.'s attention with a 2-0 start. Luckily for them, the Chargers are their competition.
23	New York Giants	The Giants have 13 points in two games, and the worst rushing offense in the league.
24	New Orleans Saints	The Saints are allowing a league-worst 512.5 yards per game and a league-worst 32.5 points per game Those are not typos.
25	Buffalo Bills	Bills RBs LeSean McCoy and Mike Tolbert rushed for 14 yards on 15 carries against Carolina.
26	Los Angeles Chargers	USC outdrew the Chargers and Rams combined in a victory over Texas.
27	Chicago Bears	The Mike Glennon revenge game looked more like a validation game for the Bucs.
28	Cincinnati Bengals	The Bengals are the first team since the 1939 Eagles to open a season with two home games and no TDs.
29	Cleveland Browns	DeShone "Scottie Pippen" Kizer left with a migraine in the 2nd quarter after a three-and-out, a fumble, an INT and a punt.
30	Indianapolis Colts	Andrew Luck has already been ruled out for Sunday's draft-positioning game against Cleveland.
31	San Francisco 49ers	Brian Hoyer's 146 passing yards per game are the worst among NFL starters with two starts.
32	New York Jets	Let's be honest: After watching the Jets' QB play the last couple of seasons, tanking makes perfect sense.
